

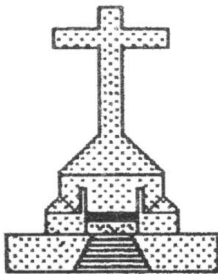

Dear Brothers and sisters of Medjugorje North East and beyond, the grace of another Lent is with us, and the word ‘Lent’ means springtime, a springtime of the soul. So too as in nature we see the signs of spring around us, Our Lady Queen of Peace reminds us that she is calling us to new life. A new life of the soul, of the spirit. This is why Mary always reminds us that we are in a time of Grace, because her presence with us in Medjugorje is indeed a **“Call to new life.”**

Mary begins this month’s message with that invitation to new life. The new life of her Son, the new life symbolised in St. John’s account of the new wine flowing abundantly at the wedding feast of Cana, where Mary says to the disciples, *“Do whatever he tells you.”* (John: 2: 5:)

At the Annunciation, (Luke:1:26-38) Mary receives the new life of her son, and standing near the Cross of Jesus, Mary receives this gift of new life as

the first disciple, the Mother of all believers (John: 19: 25)

“Today I am calling you to a new life.” Mary is telling us that it is better to live with God, to open oneself to God, to receive peace in prayer, to receive the power of forgiveness in Confession, and to forgive. When we no longer work on our conversion then we feel a sleepiness overcoming our souls, a sluggishness of spirit, and we stay only lukewarm. Then we become weak and prone to complain that God does not see, hear or help us. Mary does not want to see us in our spiritual desert, that is why she comes to us. To call us to the new life of Faith, the new life of Jesus in the Sacraments, and the new life of his living word.

It is good and positive that Mary tells us, **“It is not important how old you are open your heart to Jesus, who will transform you.”** The call to the New Life in Christ is for everyone,

the unconditional surrender of every heart regardless of age, is Mary's reason for being with us. So many say, *"Now I'm too old and tired to convert, to be renewed, too old to have any use in Mary's plans."* Or we may say, *"I'm too young just now, or I'm only middle aged, I have plenty of time ahead!"*

But Our Lady says, we are called to the New Life of Grace now, no matter our age. Mary is the Mother of new life, the new Eve, the Queen of Peace, and therefore it is important to recognise in this message the meaning of the new times to which she is guiding us. Opening our hearts means to take seriously the Word of God so that it may bear fruit in us. Holiness begins in the heart, and Mary calls us to create a new space in our hearts for the Word. This is how we overcome all our weaknesses and sins, by the grace of God

"And you will open your hearts to Heaven and the things of Heaven."

Only the vigilant can stay on the path to holiness and faith and love. That is why we must strive to free ourselves continuously from the spirit of the world, and to live the life of holiness, and permit the Holy Spirit to govern us from the inside. Heaven is Mary's goal for us, and it is important that we pray for the grace to constantly stay open in our hearts with a desire for heaven. We must pray asking the Holy Spirit to increase the yearning for the eternal life within us. So that the material world and the power of evil do not distract us. Heaven is our true home, and the things of heaven are Love, Peace, Truth and Joy.

In finishing Mary tells us that the Lord has permitted her to be with us,

and it becomes more apparent each day that her presence and the apparitions are indeed a gift and a grace to all. We need to understand and accept that it is a gift for her to be with us. Mary, shows us again as a true Mother who loves to be with her children.

The greatest suffering of a Mother is if she is not allowed to be with her children, especially if they are sick and are in pain. Let us renew our thanksgiving in Our Lady's presence with us and joyfully go with her on the path of holiness, the path of new life.

**Dear children of Medjugorje,
praise be to Jesus and Mary!**

On February 2nd, 2019, Mirjana received her monthly apparition in her pension house, surrounded by a small group. After the apparition, she conveyed the message:. (see page 4)

2. Saint Joseph is looking for work! On March 19th, we will celebrate the feast day of the great Saint Joseph, husband of the Mother of God. In our home, the tradition is to offer him a thirty-day novena starting February 16 to March 18, where we pray the Saint Joseph litany every day. We always ask him for many favours, as he doesn't like being redundant when it comes to obtaining graces for us.

It's not possible for St. Joseph to be that old man who is often depicted by painters. It would have required a strong man to flee to Egypt by night with a very young wife and a newborn baby. In addition, once they arrived in Egypt, he would have had to provide for his family. Local traditions in Egypt reveal a responsible man who had to flee Herod's spies. Seeing that he had missed his target despite the massacre of the innocents in Bethlehem, Herod was constantly searching for the little King of the Jews whom he feared so terribly! The Holy Family had to travel several thousand kilometers in

the space of four years, before the death of Herod. Later on, in Nazareth, Saint Joseph had to rebuild a viable source of income from scratch, an activity that would provide for his family, by returning to his fine job as a carpenter. In his workshop, he had to carry heavy loads, beams, paneling, carts, furniture and other objects that he manufactured daily, and deliver them to his customers. Is he not the one who taught Jesus to carry heavy beams on his shoulders, preparing Him for His painful climb to Golgotha?

He still likes to work today and through this thirty-day novena we offer him a great opportunity to spoil us and shower us with great blessings!



3. The "interrupters". A few pilgrims traveled to Tihaljina (30 minutes from Medjugorje) to pray before the famous miraculous statue of the Blessed Mother. For many people, this statue is the emblem of Medjugorje, however it was offered

to this church before the apparitions took place in Medjugorje.

After prayer, a pilgrim asked my Spanish friend, Teresa, to take a picture in front of the statue to immortalise this blessed moment. Once the picture was taken, a man kneeled before the statue and, with his head in his hands, began to pray with fervour. The pilgrim, seeing that the photo was beautiful, asked Teresa to take another one. But Teresa told her to wait so as not to interrupt the man praying. This prayer went on and on, for more than 20 minutes, so the pilgrim became impatient and said out loud: "Well, no point in waiting any longer for the photo, let's go!"

The man, hearing this remark apologized and got up to give her some room. A new picture was taken. But when Teresa saw this second picture, she was in for a surprise! The sweet face of Mary had changed. She expressed a silent reproach, clearly visible in her eyes and her mouth. The pilgrim understood the message: She should never have interrupted the man's prayer for a photo!



When she was just 6 years old, St Catherine of Sienna was playing

outside with her little brother. Suddenly the Lord Jesus appeared to her, seated on the chair of Peter and dressed in pontifical clothes. Fascinated by this apparition, little Catherine was absorbed by God who was speaking to her and was already preparing her for her great mission in the Church, close to the papacy. This conversation lasted for some minutes when the little boy, impatient to continue playing, drew her out of her contemplation. She turned around and scolded him, but when she returned to her prayer and looked again in the direction of the apparition, Jesus was gone! This plunged her into deep sadness. Jesus himself would undoubtedly have liked to continue His dialogue with her... But the distraction had ended this moment of divine intimacy.

How often does the same scene occur in our churches! Too few people really pray with their heart. So should we not in fact rejoice to see others immersed in a relationship with God? Who knows what is going on between God and a soul? Who knows if God has not planned to give a specific grace to His child at that moment? Who are we to interrupt an intimate dialogue between God and a soul? This dialogue is sacred. Of course, in the event of an emergency, we have to interrupt them, but that does not happen at every Mass!

One day, I was praying after Holy Communion with my head in my hands. Someone patted me on the shoulder and asked me, "Are you Sister Emmanuel?" I must confess that I was not very kind, because I said, "It doesn't matter who I am, but

the one I'm trying to talk to is Jesus!" I quickly repented of my reaction because the person must surely have been hurt. So now, whenever this happens, I say: "Yes, we will speak to each other, but please let me first finish speaking with Jesus who is in my heart! Besides, He is also in your heart, why not give Him another 10 minutes of your time to talk to Him?" The fruits are excellent! One day, a group of eight pilgrims came to interrupt me; so I exhorted them to pray for a few more minutes in silence. All of them did so willingly, and they were so blessed that after 10 minutes, they no longer wanted to leave the church!

4. A memorable confession Lent is approaching, so I wish to share a testimony that will touch the hearts of those who are still lukewarm...

Around 1840, a man named Rochette had a disabled child. He decided to take the child to the Priest of Ars, the "Curé d'Ars" as Saint Jean-Marie Vianney was called, and who was known for the miracles that took place through his prayer. His wife accompanied him. She went to confession to the holy priest and received Holy Communion. But Rochette only cared for one thing: the child's recovery. He did visit the church a few times, but never beyond the holy water font. He was standing at the back of the church when the saint, coming from behind the altar where he gave confession to priests, began to call him in a loud voice. Rochette didn't move. His wife and son were in front, near the communion table.

"So he really doesn't believe?" The saintly priest asked the mother. He called Rochette again. Finally, at the third call, the man decided to walk up. "After all", he thought, "the Cure of Ars won't do me harm!" And he went off to join the Curé behind the altar.

"And now let's have a chat, the two of us, Mr. Rochette," he said, pointing to the confessional. "Sit down over there!" - "Oh", said Rochette, "I don't really feel like it!" - "Well you just get started!" Unable to resist this robust onslaught, Mr. Rochette fell to his knees. "Father, he stammered, "it's been a while since ... Ten years!" - "Add on a little more!" - "Twelve years!" - "A little more!" - "Yes, since the Great Jubilee of 1826." "There we are! If we search for it, we end up finding the answer!" Rochette confessed like a child after 14 years without receiving Holy Communion. He received Communion the next day by his wife's side, and their son left behind, in the church of Ars, two crutches that had become useless.

Pray the Stations of the Cross during Lent

Devotion of the Way of the Cross in Medjugorje



Every Lent we are in a special way meditating on the passion of Christ, especially we do that in the devotion of the Way of the Cross, that we pray in the church and in families.

The Way of the Cross in the parish takes place on Fridays at 2 p.m. on Cross Mountain and in the parish church after the evening Holy Mass; at the branch churches (Šurmanci, Vionica, Miletina) 4 p.m. Devotion of the Way of the Cross began on Cross Mountain in the beginning of Our Lady's apparitions. After 1981, many pilgrims joined parishioners from surrounding areas and from all over the world.

When pilgrims climb Cross Mountain, they can all have personal encounter with Jesus in his passion as well as to discover his love.

The stations were initially marked by wooden crosses, and later replaced by bronze plaques.

The beautiful bronze plaques that make up the Way of the Cross are the works of the Florentine artist Carmelo Puzzolo. In 2003 identical stations by the same artist were erected on Mt. Michiru Malawi.

Similar sculptures of the decades of the Rosary, found on Apparition Hill, in Medjugorje, can also be found there.

Stations Of The Cross

Jesus Prays in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Begin each station -

V. We adore Thee, O Christ, and we praise Thee.

R. Because by Thy holy Cross, Thou hast redeemed the world

End each station -

Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be.

1st Station: Jesus, You are condemned to death.

Dear Lord, help us to not be so quick to judge others.

2nd Station: Jesus, You Receive Your Cross on Your shoulders.

Dear Lord, Please help us to accept the crosses that come our way and to bear them with a willing spirit.

3rd Station: Jesus, You fall for the first time beneath the Cross.

Dear Lord, help us to keep going even when we feel we can't take another step.

4th Station: Jesus, You meet your Holy Mother.

Dear Lord, please Help us to offer comfort and consolation and to be a source of strength for others.

5th Station: Jesus, Simon of Cyrene helps You carry the Cross.

Dear Lord, Don't let us turn our back on anyone in need.

6th Station: Jesus, Veronica offers You her veil & wipes Your face
Dear Lord, help us to be the ones who comes in to offer kindness when the whole world has gone out.

7th Station: Jesus, You fall the second time beneath the Cross
Dear Lord, please help us to have the courage to continue. Help us to face another day.

8th Station: Jesus, You console the women of Jerusalem.
Dear Lord, even when we are hurting, help us to remember that others are hurting also. Help us to not be self-centered and to continue to reach out to those who need us.

9th Station: Jesus, You fall the third time.
Dear Lord, help us to continue when the way is hard and we have lost all hope. Please guide our faltering steps.

10th Station: Jesus, You are stripped of Your garments .
Dear Lord, please help us to share my material goods with others, to feed the hungry and clothe the naked.

11th Station: Jesus, You are being nailed to the Cross. With each nail, the pain grew greater, each blow a vivid reminder of our sins.
Dear Lord, thank you for your love. Thank you for dying to forgive our sins. Help us to do your will.

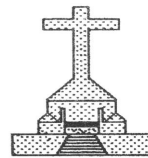
12th Station: Jesus, You are dying on the Cross. Jesus cried out "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" Yet He also found the strength to forgive His persecutors.

Dear Lord, at times when we feel abandoned, help us to remember that you understand and are always at our side.

13th Station: Jesus, You are taken down from the Cross and placed in the embrace of your Mother
Dear Lord, help us to remember the mothers who have lost children to violence and criminal activity. Help us to pray for them as they suffer so much pain.

14th Station: Jesus, You are placed into the tomb. And then there was darkness. The tomb was a place of transition for Jesus — a stopping place between death and new life.
Dear Lord, please help me as I go through my own times in the tomb and the dark, times when I feel lost and scared, fearful of change.

15th Station – The Resurrection –
Dear Lord, Help us to see your light, guiding us safely to new life. Of Peace Joy and Love.

Archbishop Henryk Hoser Appointed by Pope Francis as Apostolic Visitor to Medjugorje

Expansion of Shrine Revealed

Adapted from a Sarajevo Times article published January 6, 2019 Msgr Henryk Hoser, has announced



the expansion and construction of a shrine in this town located in Herzegovina. “An important argument in favour of Medjugorje is the statistics of Medjugorje itself,” Archbishop Hoser said in an interview for Vecernji.hr. “We see the number of pilgrims increasing, and not only that pilgrims come from all over the world, but, after their return home, they do everything to keep on living in the spirit they have discovered here in Medjugorje. It seems to me that there are more people in the world who know where Medjugorje is located than the capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina.”

Speaking on the expansion of the shrine, he said that a group of architects is already preparing the project. “The plan is to extend the space for liturgical celebrations, which will meet all the climatic conditions; it will be cool during summer, and warm in the winter. The open square, the outer altar space, does not protect the people who

participate in the liturgical celebrations. We are still thinking we should build a chapel,” Hoser said.

Meeting of The Apostolic Visitor and Apostolic Nuncio with the Diocesan Bishop of Mostar

On Saturday, 21 July 2018, the Diocesan Bishop Msgr. Ratko Perić received Archbishop *ad personam* Henryk Hoser, S.A.C., Bishop-emeritus of Warszawa-Praga, the recently appointed Apostolic Visitor with special character for the pastoral reality of the parish of Medjugorje in the Diocese of Mostar-Duvno. The mandate of the Apostolic Visitor to Medjugorje is of “a temporary duration *ad nutum Sanctae Sedis*” (at the disposition of the Holy See).

Archbishop Luigi Pezzuto, Apostolic Nuncio to Bosnia-Herzegovina, accompanied the Apostolic Visitor from Sarajevo.

In an hour long conversation with the Apostolic Visitor and the Apostolic Nuncio, the Diocesan Bishop expressed his respect for the decision of the Holy Father Pope Francis on appointing Archbishop Hoser as Apostolic Visitor to the parish of Medjugorje, manifested his willingness towards necessary co-operation and wished him God’s abundant help in his Apostolic Visit, which began Sunday, 22 July.

While noting the fact that the final ruling on the authenticity of the

"Medjugorje phenomenon" is reserved to the Supreme Authority of the Church, the Bishop unambiguously reiterated the permanent position of the Chancery Office of Mostar, that is, of the former Bishop Ordinary Pavao Žanić (1980-1993) and the current Ordinary, that on the basis of the numerous investigations, it does not hold as authentic, any "apparition", any "message", any "secret", any "parchment", of which the local Bishops regularly informed the Holy See and the Catholic public. Amongst these unbelievable apparitions of the "Medjugorje phenomenon" are also included those of the first seven or ten days of the year 1981, of which the Diocesan Bishop gave an argued explanation, which has already been published in Croatian, English and Italian.

The Apostolic Visitor said that he has been appointed exclusively for the pastoral reality in Medjugorje and that his task is to strengthen the unity of the Church.

The Bishop added that this fraternal encounter, for which he also sincerely thanks the Apostolic Nuncio and the Apostolic Visitor, serves towards strengthening true peace and unity in this local Church.

Religious Communities Medjugorje

(February 07, 2019)

Among the activities currently undertaken in Medjugorje by the Apostolic Visitor Msgr Henry Hoser is the regulation of the canonical and legal situation of the many

communities operating in Medjugorje. According to the Apostolic Visitor the work is extremely time-consuming, because it requires detailed discussions, examining documents according to a specially formatted questionnaire, which shows the origin of a given community, the history of its recognition, and its current legal situation, according to the code of canon law.

Msgr Hoser mentioned three communities already under study: The Community of Blessings, formerly known as the "Lion of Judah and the Lamb of the Sacrifice", which has a female branch in Medjugorje. The sisters work on papal law, but do not yet have the local bishop's approval. Another community is the "Oasis of Peace". Its charism is the promotion of peace both in the personal and social dimension, and thus also in the life of the Church and the nation. A third community is the organisation known as "New Horizons" which cares for people in need.

Msgr Henryk Hoser Concelebrated Holy Mass with Fr. Marinko Sakota and many other priests.

He spent some time with the members of the prayer groups deriving from Medjugorje.

There are many prayer communities present in Medjugorje and

Archbishop Hoser called them all “one big Medjugorje community”.



"St. Peter the Apostle gives us the example with some instructions on how we are to live in the Church, to tend the flock, not by constraint but willingly, not for shameful profit but eagerly. Not to lord it over those assigned to them, but to be examples to the flock. The leaders of the community have the primary role of serving the community", said Mons. Hoser, who spoke also about how to maintain the spirit of fellowship in our communities. He said that each one of us, in order to live responsibly in the communities needs to have some outer criteria that would estimate his behaviour and actions.

"The first and the most important reference is the Gospel and there we know that our thoughts and actions needs to be immersed in it, when our thoughts and actions need to be in accordance to the Gospel and the teaching of Jesus Christ, while the additional reference is Ten Commandments, and finally the constitution of every specific community. If our behaviour is right and if we live according to Ten Commandments, to the Gospel and to the constitution, while being obedient to the Gospel, to the Church and to Christ, we would be on the right path...", said Msgr. Hoser.

He also said that the general criteria for the healthy environment and holiness of the community are Love, Joy and Peace, while three personal criteria are Patience, Kindness and Goodness. Lastly, he added another three criteria for good functioning of the community, and those are Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self-control.

"All of these nine things I mentioned are the fruits of the Holy Spirit. The Gospel tells us while we walk in the spirit, we live in the spirit, once we receive those gifts the fruits need to be reflected too", Msgr. Hoser said at the end of his homily and finishing with the words "**Sapienti sat!**"

Ratko Perić, Bishop of Mostar-Duvno and apostolic administrator of Trebinje-Mrkan

(December 29, 2018)

Bishop Ratko Perić was 75 on February 2, 2019.

It's the age when diocesan bishops are required to submit their resignation.

However, they can continue to stay in office at the Pope's discretion. It will be interesting to see what the outcome will be and the effect it may have on any future decision regarding the Medjugorje phenomenon.
